

Over the past decade, the U.N. Human Rights Council, its Special Rapporteurs, and various Treaty Bodies have called upon Kyrgyzstan to improve the rule of law by complying with human rights standards. These bodies recommended specific actions that the Kyrgyz Republic should take to better respect, protect and fulfill human rights pursuant to its treaty obligations.

The new TSPC report "*Compendium on Recommendations for the Kyrgyz Republic from United Nations Human Rights Council, Treaty Bodies, and Special Procedures*" provides an overview of the actions that the Kyrgyz Republic should undertake to comply with its human rights obligations as specifically recommended by State parties under the U.N. Human Rights Council Universal Periodic Review (UPR) process, by Special Rapporteurs completing missions to Kyrgyzstan, the Concluding Observations of various Treaty Bodies to which Kyrgyzstan is a party, and the decisions of the Human Rights Committee in cases brought under the First Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR). It also includes the recommendations given by the Kyrgyz Inquiry Commission which investigated events in southern Kyrgyzstan in June 2010, as well as those in the Report of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights on technical assistance and cooperation on human rights for Kyrgyzstan.

The *Compendium* was presented by the OHCHR in dialogue among government ministries in Kyrgyzstan, international experts and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) April 24-26th in Bishkek and lays the foundation for further discussion with policy makers on improving national action plans.
